Welcome to the new edition of The Mast Head, the quarterly newsletter for Assembly 94. At the May assembly business meeting, four resolutions were read. As per business protocol, they were tabled so that they could be published out to the Assembly. At the June assembly business meeting, we held discussion on these resolutions and voted on them as no changes were made. Two of those resolutions were the primary reason to do this process; These were to re-establish the quorum numbers and to increase the amount we can spend as an assembly without needing to do this similar process of tabling and voting a month later as often. One resolution was included at this time as it is an update to our by-laws as a way to align our by-laws to our assembly practices and tradition.

The fourth and final resolution was to rename our assembly. Assembly 94 has officially been "Longmont Assembly 94" with Supreme Knights of Columbus for as long as records of the assembly name show. As Assembly 94 now includes Mead, and its membership draws from and serves Longmont, Mead, Frederick, Firestone, Niwot, Berthoud, and other communities outside of Longmont, we wanted to have an assembly name that reflected this. It was proposed that we change the name to "St. Michael the Archangel Assembly 94". Discussion was held of other possible names, but it was unanimously accepted that we would choose St. Michael the Archangel as our saint.

These resolutions were passed unanimously and the work was done to correct our by-laws. As you are now reading this, we are "St Michael the Archangel Assembly 94". The name change does go through a process for officially changing with Supreme, which we are in the process of.

Along with this new fraternal year, we have changed the newsletter format. Mostly this is just for ease of editing. We hope you like the new layout and continued newsletter.

If you review the Upcoming Assembly Events below, you will also see that we are holding our October business meeting at Guardian Angels in Mead. We hope to see everyone there. Our November meeting is being held on the 3rd Thursday of the month, November 21st, so as not to conflict with Thanksgiving. We are suspending our December business meeting until January due to the Christmas holiday and how busy the holiday season is for everyone.

Color Corps Events and Happenings

As you have noticed, we have really cut back on the events that our Color Corps participate in. The reason for this is two-fold. First is that over the last 2-3 years, we have really over-booked our color corps and this has caused some burn-out on the members of the color corps, especially as many past members of the color corps have not participated in years, leaving others to cover the many events. The second reason is due to the regalia/uniform switch over. As was published in our meeting minutes and in the previous newsletter, Supreme has announced that any usage of the classic regalia is not allowed starting on July 1, 2019. As of July 1st, we only have 4 active color corps members who have the new uniform. With this small number of available CC members, we have had to cut back to only a few events a year.

This should be a sad happening that we can't participate as often as we used to. While we can mourn the stoppage of the classic regalia, it is beyond time to move on. If we as an assembly, a degree, and an order, would like to continue to be the visible arm of the degree and serve our parishes, it is time for Sir Knights to step up and purchase the new uniform. After all, we are not

knights because of what we wear, we wear the uniform because we are knights. All it takes is to measure yourself and order the uniform at www.knightsgear.com. Current orders are being received within 1 to 2 weeks from the order being placed (one knight ordered on either Friday or Saturday and had it by Thursday of the next week, less than a week!)

If you cannot afford the new regalia at this time, the assembly has a regalia fund to help you. You do have to order the uniform first. Once the order is placed, email kofcassembly94@gmail.com with the subject "Regalia Fund." Include a copy of the email showing your purchase, your name, mailing address and membership number, and how much of the uniform cost you would like us to assist with, up to the entire cost. This will then be sent to the officers for a quick review, and then a check will be written to you for the amount requested. We ask that you pay back to the assembly as you are able to. If you can pay \$25 a month back, that is great. This will help the fund to continue to support future knights who need it.

Related to this, we do have swords with scabbards and service baldrics available for any knights who need them. These were donated to us by knights who did not need them anymore. Just email kofcassembly94@gmail.com and ask to have one, and they are yours to keep. If you don't want to pay the full price that The English Company charges, you can find swords and scabbards on ebay.

If you are a past color corps member who does not want to buy the new uniform, and do not intend to keep your sword, the assembly would be glad to take the sword, service baldric and gloves. As we are continuing to add new sir knights and they join the color corps, they can use the swords that are sitting unused. Please contact FN Bill Brooks to arrange donating them or come to an assembly meeting and donate then.

We look forward to you joining our color corps and keeping the tradition alive in our parishes and community.

Chalice and Paten Donation

One of the benefits of being an Assembly member is participating in the Chalice Fund. The Chalice Fund is a fund you can pay into annually each year. Most members only pay \$5, but you can always pay more if you choose.
