Merry Christmas and Happy and Blessed New year! As this issue of Knights Call hits your inboxes, we are half-way through our fraternal year. Here's how we are doing as we enter the New Year: we have recruited 335 new Knights and families—37% of our goal; we have lost, through suspension, 181 Knights and their families.

While we should celebrate our achievements so far, let's also agree there is much work to be done between now and 30 June 2019 to achieve our council, district and state goals both programmatically and in membership growth. As Bishop Barron points out, we need to be "...in the army of Christ the Warrior-King and Mary our Warrior-Queen to set things right with the weapons of the Spirit," and there needs to be more of us! More of us who put our faith into action, more of us who live our Catholic faith with confidence and courage and who are the face of Christ to all we encounter, as our Worthy State Chaplain Fr. John Stearns challenged us to be at the end of our Mid-year meeting last month.

Christians of all denominations are under attack throughout the world, but none more so than Catholics. The Order's work for the Defense of Persecuted Christians throughout the world is bearing great fruit. Our Worthy Supreme Knight was at the forefront of leadership on this issue and representing nearly two million Knights of Columbus and their families, the Order was a critical catalyst in legislation passed by the US Congress for the defense of Persecuted Christians. In our own backyard, Father Andre Mahanna of St. Raftka Church in Denver is also on the front lines of this issue raising funds and helping persecuted Christians in Lebanon and many other parts of the world. Many of our Knights throughout this great state are partnered with him in this effort and I am proud to offer the continued support of the Colorado Knights of Columbus to Fr. Andre and his parishioners in their endeavor. While these world-wide efforts are important, make no mistake that Christians in the United States, especially Catholic Christians, are enduring discrimination. I've previously spoken of and written about the baker in Denver, who even though the Supreme Court ruled the Colorado Civil Rights Commission unfairly and with prejudice targeted him, he finds himself again in litigation for following his Christian conscience. In the course of the last few weeks, members of the United States Senate Judiciary Committee, in written questions to a Federal District Court Judge nominee, questioned not only his Catholic beliefs, but used his membership in the Knights of Columbus as the means to do so. Based on his membership in the Knights of Columbus these senators, who took an oath to defend the constitution against all enemies foreign and domestic, are questioning this judicial nominee's fitness to serve on a federal court solely based on his Christian beliefs that life begins at conception and ends in natural death and that marriage is

between one man and one woman, establishing faith as disqualifying to serve in public appointed office. I wonder how these elected leaders resolve this with the first amendment guarantee of religious freedom.

I offer all of this to make the point that it is important that we live our faith in action. The Order's Faith in Action program is integral to who we are and what we do not only as Knights but as Catholics. Even more importantly we must continue to attract, recruit, involve and retain Catholic men and their families into our Order. We do this best by being the face of Christ to all we encounter. As Fr. John reminded us at the Mid-Year meeting, there are many organizations that do many good acts of service, but the Knights of Columbus must be the organization that is different by being the face of Christ in all we do. We must continue to actively recruit warriors of Christ and Mary to live their faith alongside us confidently and courageously.

MASTER'S KNIGHTLY NEWS

First I would like to thank all those individuals and assemblies that were represented at the 4th Degree breakout session at Mid-year. Many of our Faithful Navigators and other officers of assemblies wear multiple hats, including District Deputies, Grand Knights, Deputy Grand Knights, etc. and were obligated with Council breakout sessions for their respective positions but yet we still had 25 Sir Knights in attendance. Again thank you.

A number of items were just a review of previous information with an emphasis being stressed, as 4th degree members, we need to focus our assemblies in participating in programs doing so in conjunction with our associated councils. Sometimes as assemblies, our leadership roles are led by members of 1 or 2 associated councils and we tend to forget about the councils that are not as well represented. That should be a clue and incentive that the assembly needs to provide a stronger presence in those councils and generate interest in the 4th degree.

Second, while trying not to beat a dead horse, the old regalia will sunset on June 30, 2019. At this point there is nothing from Supreme that would indicate there is any extension on the horizon. There has been some changes in the distribution centers so that when one purchases the new uniform, it no longer takes 6 to 8 weeks or longer but more realistically a turn-around time of a few weeks or sooner. I remind Sir Knights that the Honor Guard plays an important role in our existence and it would be sad, if because of negative opinions of change, assemblies can no longer participate in Honor Guards because they do have the "Uniform of the Day". This will be especially hard when a request comes in from a family for an Honor Guard for their loved one's funeral to honor their long time service to the Knights and there is no one is available. You can place blame if you desire on others but the word heard by the family is "no Honor Guard".

I am pleased to say there are many assemblies, though they may not care for certain items of the new uniform", have either purchased the uniform themselves or who have developed alternative funding mechanisms in their assemblies including utilizing their councils to supplement funding. Using councils provides a membership incentive to those who may not be able to afford the new uniform but would participate if they had one.

As heard in the council breakouts, membership drives programs and programs drives membership. We have pushed Wreaths Across America and this year I have heard of a number of assemblies who have stepped up getting cemeteries in their areas to participate or those cemeteries that already participate, assemblies have joined in placing wreaths on veteran's graves. Of course, other than it is done in December and can be cold, it is an easy program in which to participate. I had the opportunity last year to participate with my Assembly, Assembly 89 in Greeley, to assist in placing 250 wreaths for the first time in one of our local cemeteries that had not participated in the past. It was so well received that this year we were able to participate in the placement of 500 wreaths. Next year who knows how many more wreaths can be funded and placed on veteran's graves. Start now for next December.

Another program being introduced at mid-year is to raise funds for statuary for the Catholic chapel at the new Veterans Hospital in Aurora. The Archdiocese of Denver assigned a Chaplain to the hospital. Though there is a chapel it is pretty bare. A relatively small chapel, to be able to place Stations of the Cross, a statue of Mary w/ child and one of Joseph, would cost \$7,000. I urge every assembly raise and donate to raise these funds by our State Convention. If every assembly were to provide \$200, we would raise \$10,000 and would allow not only pay for the statuary but be able to assist Father with any other needs for items for the chapel and for those Catholic veterans attending mass. Here is an opportunity to be involved in a program that assists veterans and assists our clergy in promoting our faith. John Lopez, the 4th degree program director for the state, has sent out a memo

detailing this program and to send funds to the State Charities Secretary, Sir Knight Claude Trujillo. This will the funds to accumulate in one location for a presentation of one check and allow for individual donations to a 501 3(c). Please consider to support this worthy cause.

Finally, we are attempting to simplify the process of hosting a 4th degree exemplifications. Those assemblies who may wish to host a 4th degree but have not done so in years and do not have the time to read through the guidelines, my administrative team has put together a two page document consisting of bullet point that highlight the responsibilities of the assembly and Master and we will have the Registrar of the degree go over the information and both sides can sign off on understanding their responsibilities. No fuss, no bother. More information on that procedure will follow with the sheet being posted on our 4th degree webpage. Please consider hosting a 4th Degree Exemplification in your area.

I continue to look forward receiving input and suggestions as to ideas that can assist in generating new life into the 4th degree. Your input in expanding visibility in programming and active participation in membership recruitment is being solicited and wanted. I am encouraged and look forward to your assistance in moving our district to the top of our Province this second half of the fraternal year.

One-on-one recruiting is one of the most effective ways to get men to join our wonderful order. It is as simple as asking the man in the pew next to you to join the Knights.

If your Council has not already done so, it is time to start planning a church drive to boost membership in your Council:

1. Get your Pastor's permission, then schedule a date.
2. Order the membership materials for the drive, be sure to at least have the following:
 - a. "Why Join" - #10537
 - b. "Recruiter Business Card" - #10536
 - c. "24 Hours Can Change Your Life" - #10099
 - d. The GK and the FS are able to order these materials, get at least 100 of each
3. Invite the 4th Degree to participate in the membership drive
4. Invite your DD and Field agent to participate in the membership drive
5. Call or email me if your Council needs assistance with the Church Drive
 - a. The State team does not do the drive for you; however, we are here to help your Council be successful
 - b. The State team can help train your Council prior to the drive as well as provide team members on the day of the drive to assist
6. Schedule a breakfast on the day of the event, so there is a place for parishioners to congregate after the Masses.
 - a. Have the membership materials listed in item 2 above on every table
 - b. Be sure to have a Knight walking around filling coffee and inviting men to join
 - c. Remember to talk to the wives as well as the men – many men join because the wife encourages them to join
7. At least 2 Sundays before the actual drive, publish a message about the Knights and the membership drive in your Parish Bulletin – be sure to include the online membership website in the bulleting: www.kofc.org/JoinUs
8. On the weekend of the drive, have a Knight speak from the Pulpit at each Mass, if your Pastor allows, keep the speech brief – 2 minutes maximum. Have Council members and outside all doors of the Church after every Mass to pass out the membership material and answer any questions about the Knights.

Thank you all for all that you do for the Knights of Columbus, your parish, and your community. Inviting a man to join the Knights will change his life for the better. Remember that every Council event is an opportunity to recruit new members.

BUILDING THE COLORADO 4TH DEGREE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS MEMBERSHIP

The 4th Degree of the Order needs growth. To better serve the Church, our communities, our society and our families – we need more Sir Knights. Our mission will be enhanced as we welcome more 3rd Degree Knights through exemplification to the Patriotic Degree. As we encourage young Catholic gentlemen to not only join the Knights of Columbus but to attain all four degrees within the Order, we are enabled to serve the Lord and His Church more effectively.

Our growth program for the 4th Degree membership is defined as the ***“Three R’s”....Refresh, Recruit and Reinforce.***

REFRESH:

Rejuvenating the Assembly Meeting Will Invite More Attendance and More Participation

What Members Have Said:

“The meetings are boring.”

“Conversations and topics ramble on and on.”

“I want to enjoy fraternization with other brother Knights, that doesn’t seem to happen.”

“I ask myself after the meeting, what did I gain from attending and I can’t find an answer.”

“I appreciate some spiritual strengthening as a Knight when I attending meetings, but I don’t get it.”

“For the most part, I get information I need from the Council or in an email.”

The Facts:

1. Sometimes assembly meeting often go on for 1 – 1.5 hours when they could be better organized and condensed into 30-45 minutes. Members are less likely to attend long and disorganized meetings. To invite new potential Sir Knights, participation should be energizing, entertaining and purposeful.
2. Social or entertainment portion of meetings are important to attendees and a vital segment of productive gatherings.
3. Guest speakers and/or video presentations infuse activity and enjoyment into meetings.
4. The real connections to membership growth are active and participating 4th Degree Knights inviting their brother 3rd Degree Knights (in their Councils) to join the Patriotic Order.
5. The real value in 4th Degree Assembly growth is that it should be designed to edify, strengthen and empower Brother Knights to become better husbands, fathers and Catholic gentlemen especially within the scope of patriotism and civic involvement.

Recommendations:

- Streamline the Assembly Meeting. Expand your social time after the Meeting.
- Request that each Council that falls within your Assembly, provide a brief written activity report prior to your Assembly meeting. It helps inform and motivate in an organized fashion.
- Distribute an Assembly Meeting Agenda (ideally via email) to the Assembly members prior to the Meeting.
- Perhaps have pizza and beverages in the 30 minutes prior to your scheduled Assembly meeting or have refreshments afterwards.
- Emphasize Spiritual Strengthening and Member Fraternization.
- Schedule periodic “guest speakers” for a 10-minute presentation.

RECRUIT:

Locating the 3rd Degree Knights in Your Affiliate Council and Invite Them (Personally) to Exemplify to the 4th Degree

Recommendations:

- Each Sir Knight should invite a Brother 3rd Degree Knight (from your Council) to consider the 4th Degree at your next Council Meeting -- 1 on 1.
- Faithful Navigators and Membership Chairman should request a 3rd degree roster from your affiliate council(s).
- As an Assembly, host a 4th Degree Corporate Communion 1-2 times per year in which all Knights, all degrees, all councils are invited and a small social is held afterwards.
- Invite the 3rd Degree Knight to join the 4th Degree. Help them complete the Form Four.

MAJOR SOCIAL EVENT(S):

- As an Assembly, consider having at least one (if not two) major social event within your fraternal year.
- This “event” should combine a social gathering of Sir Knights and their spouses, 3rd Degree Knights (prospective Sir Knights) and their spouses, a “featured speaker or guest”, a dinner or simply a cocktail hour prior to the featured guest’s presentation.
- Your event creates a wonderful opportunity for the Assembly to increase their visibility while inviting more Catholic men to either join the Knights (1st Degree) invites more Catholic men to exemplify to the Patriotic Degree.
- Several Assemblies who have done this, actually invited all Knights, all degrees, all Councils who were interested in advancing to the Patriotic Degree as well as generating interest for those men wanting to join the Order in the 1st Degree.
- If you are interested in doing this, please visit with the **4th Degree Membership Director** who can help you organize your event.

REINFORCE:

Don’t Let The New Sir Knight “Fall Off the Grid”

Recommendations:

- Ensure that a Brother Sir Knight not only **invites** the new Sir Knight to the next Assembly Meeting, offer to **take him** to the meeting yourself.
- Invite the new Sir Knight to **serve** on a committee or project immediately.
- Make sure the new Sir Knight is **added to the mailing list** and any communication roster immediately.

What our communities, families and society needs are more Catholic gentlemen setting a standard and example for others.

Knights of Columbus – Sir Knights from the 4th Degree – are a prime resource for the Catholic gentlemen that we as a nation earnestly need.


