"As generous distributors of God's manifold grace, put your gifts at the service of one another, each in the measure he has received. The one who speaks is to deliver God's message. The one who serves is to do it with the strength provided by God. Thus in all of you God is to be glorified through Jesus Christ." (1 Peter 4:10-11a)

I've used this passage from 1 Peter before. It's a powerful passage that reminds us that first and foremost we are Christians and everything we are and have

is through God's grace and that He gives us particular gifts and we are called to use those gifts in service for His glory and our Neighbor's good.

A great way to use the gifts God has given us is for us, as Catholic Christians, to evangelize—to be the models of God's love and spread our faith to others. Our mission to evangelize is consistent with Father McGivney's vision for our Order; to lead others to faith in God by being examples of Christ to others. Father McGivney provided for our continual formation through the daily living of the principles of fraternalism: charity, unity and fraternity. As Knights, officers and leaders in our councils, districts and state, we are called to model these principles in our everyday actions. It is through the living of these principles that are able to accomplish our good works and, more importantly, live and defend our faith in our families, parishes and communities.

I don't believe there is much dispute that religion in general and Christianity specifically, is under attack today. There are many examples, but one I highlight this month and one with which I need your immediate help is the Colorado Legislature's most recent attempt to eliminate Columbus Day as a state holiday. For more than a decade, there have been various attempts to do so and they have failed. We as Colorado Knights have been instrumental in the efforts to protect and defend the preservation of Columbus Day as a state holiday. We have been present at hearings and provided testimony that helped defeat previous legislative efforts. This year, things have changed dramatically. A few weeks ago, a committee of the Colorado House of Representatives passed HB19-1185. It's on its way to the House floor then to the Senate. Over the years, the bill and the arguments for it have evolved. The bill that passed was innocuously presented to eliminate Columbus Day and make Colorado Day on 1 August the state holiday. We know, however, that the bill's purpose is more ominous than that. The removal of Columbus Day was and is designed as a condemnation of Columbus, his achievements and more importantly to repudiate the introduction of Christianity into the lands he explored. This is an important battle and worth our time to engage. There has been a great deal of political maneuvering on this bill such as last minute scheduling of committee hearings to preclude opposing testimony and viewpoints. You don't use these kinds of tactics if your motives are pure. This issue should be important to us as Knights of Columbus. If you agree that Columbus Day should remain a state holiday in Colorado please contact your elected representatives and senators immediately. The message can be as simple as, "Hello, I'm ______, I live in Senate district XX and I am contacting Representative/Senator (name) to say that I am against the bill that seeks to eliminate the Columbus Day holiday (HB19-1185). You can call or email them. Their information is available on the state government website. If you are so inclined, please do so right away. This will make a difference.

To evangelize also means to provide other Catholic men and their families with the opportunity to serve God and neighbor. A great way to do that is to ask them to join our great Order—to provide the gift that will change their lives profoundly and forever. I ask every member in every council, but especially every officer, to recruit a new Knight and family in honor of our founder, Father Michael J. McGivney, to mark the 137th Anniversary of our Order this month. While we always prefer a traditional recruitment and initiation of a new member, if that proves too difficult, bring in the new member through the On-Line membership program with the resolve to convert the member to full membership in your council before 15 April 2019. I ask you to take this challenge to recruit a new Knight very seriously and avoid the proverbial eye-rolling that comes with these challenges as just another feeble plea by the state deputy to increase numbers. This is never about the numbers, this is about helping others grow in faith and to serve God and neighbor—to evangelize and provide the opportunity to do likewise.

This month marks the final quarter of our fraternal year. I am thankful of everyone's efforts so far this year. There is much work to be done to achieve our goals. It can be done, but it will take the committed effort of very Knight, council officer, district deputy and state officer. We live in challenging times, and in my view, times that are as challenging if not more so than those endured by Father McGivney and those first Knights. They knew and we know that evil prevails when good men do nothing. We are good and faithful Catholic men but we need every good and faithful Catholic man and their families to use the gifts given them by God for His glory and our neighbor's good. Ask them to join us TODAY!

MASTER'S KNIGHTLY NEWS

As we get nearer to our Colorado State Convention, I wish to remind assemblies of an opportunity to support both our clergy and our veterans by donating toward the purchase of statuary for the Catholic chapel at the new Veteran's Hospital in Aurora. It is a relatively small chapel but it is quite bare of any type of statuary including a cross. I am providing a couple of photos that depict 3 stained glass windows, an altar and the barren walls. If each of our assemblies donated \$200, we would be able to raise \$10,000. The cost of the statuary requested by the chaplain is approximately \$7,500 that includes Stations of the Cross, a statue of Mary holding baby Jesus and one of Joseph. If we are able to raise the \$10,000, additional funds may be used to purchase a crucifix and other items beneficial for the chaplain. As of this writing we are well below our goal sitting at \$1,400. Some assemblies advise the "check is in the mail" or that the assembly is bringing it up at their next meeting. This may be true but I would like

us to raise the funds by our State Convention and that will be upon us in the very near future. Please step up and donate to a much worthy cause for both our clergy and veterans. Any funds collected or donated should be sent to the State Charities Secretary, Sir Knight Claude Trujillo, with a notation on the memo line "For Catholic VA Statuary".

On February 9th, I had the opportunity to attend a "Night for Knights" at Immaculate Heart of Mary parish hall in Northglenn. This was sponsored by the Bethlehem Assembly 1966 in conjunction with Bishop Sheen Council 7502 and their Ladies Auxiliary. The night was devoted to the recruitment of parishioners into the Knights as well as encouraging current 3rd degree members to join the 4th degree. The guest speaker was former NFL quarterback Don Horn who played for the Green Bay Packers, Denver Broncos, Cleveland Browns and finally the San Diego Chargers. He spoke of playing for Hall of Fame coach Vince Lombardi, 4th Degree Knight of Columbus and the lessons learned.

Don Horn became a Catholic while playing for Green Bay. His wife was Catholic and he played for Lombardi who went to daily mass. Asked why with this influence was he not a Knight of Columbus until about 3 years ago. His response was all too familiar, "No one asked me". How many men do we miss on a daily or weekly basis as we ourselves attend mass and do not inquire, "Are you a Knight?' to someone we may not know. Ed O'Shaughnessy, the State 4th Degree Membership Director can provide this same opportunity to all assemblies. I can tell you from my experience last week, the presentation is well received by men and women as there were questions from ladies in the audience. I am sure that Ed would welcome other assemblies and their respective councils and ladies auxiliaries to conduct a similar program. We have this wonderful opportunity and I would encourage assemblies to consider utilizing this tool.

Finally we have three (3) 4th degree exemplifications scheduled. By the time this edition of the Knights Call is out, we will have had our exemplification completed at Northglenn. The 4th degree scheduled for May 19th at St. Patrick's in Colorado Springs has been cancelled and I am encouraging an assembly or assemblies to step up and host a 4th degree in the southern part of the state. With the number of assemblies in the Colorado Springs and Pueblo area, I am hoping there would be one assembly that would step up and provide the opportunity for their Brother 3rd Degree Knights to attend a 4th degree nearby.

The other two exemplifications are for June 15th in Littleton and October 26th in Windsor. Remember that the registration process has been simplified over the years and any member of the Master's Advisory Team can assist an assembly with both information and help to be a host assembly.

Let us together, move forward and continue to look to expand the visibility of programming and active participation in membership recruitment. Help to grow the 4th degree in Colorado and the Order.






